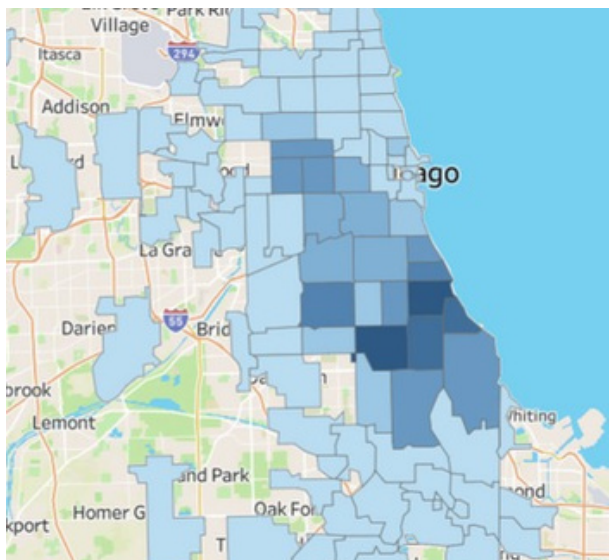

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Illinois (BCBSIL) is committed to improving the health and well-being of its members and the communities it serves. Part of that commitment involves investing in local workforces to help communities thrive. At their facilities in the Morgan Park and Pilsen neighborhoods, BCBSIL employs over 400 customer service advocates and information technology team members. The Pilsen facility also prioritizes hiring bilingual staff to support Spanish-language members with customer support needs.

BCBSIL has placed over 100 Skills candidates in roles, resulting in over \$3.75 million in wages. These roles range from entry-level to experienced positions. Additionally, BCBSIL engages with the Skills' network through job fairs, recruitment events, and informational sessions to support job seekers and provide insights into career pathways within the company.

# ABOUT COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

In 2024, our Community & Strategic Partnerships team deepened relationships with workforce and community-based organizations across Chicago, with a continued focus on improving job seeker experiences and outcomes.

By streamlining the candidate journey and strengthening referral pathways, we saw a measurable increase in job placements driven by community referrals, and more than one-third of our placements came from referrals from our network of community partners.

To bring our services closer to the communities we serve, Skills staff continued to work on-site with partner organizations in Englewood, North Lawndale, and Gage Park—ensuring more accessible, place-based support for local job seekers.

## *Partner Spotlight*



Since 1997, PODER has provided vital services to empower Spanish-speaking adult immigrants to create successful and fulfilling new lives in the United States. Located in Gage Park on the city's southwest side, PODER provides integration services that support families and communities city-wide. PODER provides a comprehensive support system of connections and a critical foundation that prepares individuals to enter the workforce in Chicago communities.

In 2023, when PODER opened its new facility in Gage Park, PODER and Skills launched a partnership that allowed recruiters to work on-site to support local job seekers. PODER partners with Skills to provide culturally relevant resources and foster pathways to employment for job seekers. Together, PODER and Skills advocate for fair hiring practices and work closely with employers to ensure roles are inclusive and equitable, and that diverse candidates are considered.

PODER's services put their community first and ensure that individuals feel supported, heard, and understood as they navigate the job-seeking journey. Skills is proud to work alongside PODER to influence change in Chicago's workforce and provide Spanish-speakers and immigrant families with the tools they need to thrive.

# EXPANDING BEYOND CHICAGO



In 2024, Skills for America's Future continued to expand its reach by launching Connect to Work GA in partnership with the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce.

Connect to Work GA in Atlanta joins Connect to Work AZ, a program out of the Greater Phoenix Chamber of Commerce Foundation, as a "Powered by Skills" affiliate, adding to the impact created by Skills' Chicago and Rhode Island stand-alone sites. Together, these sites are demonstrating the effectiveness of Skills' jobs-first model and creating a positive impact in communities across the country.

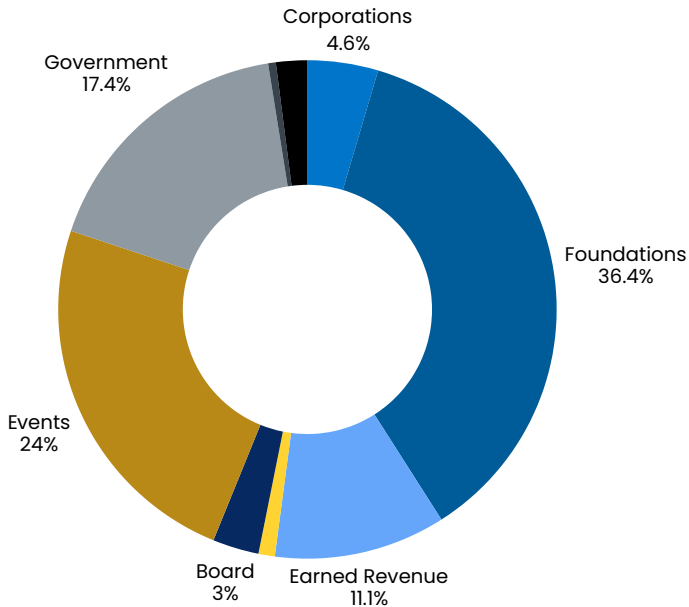

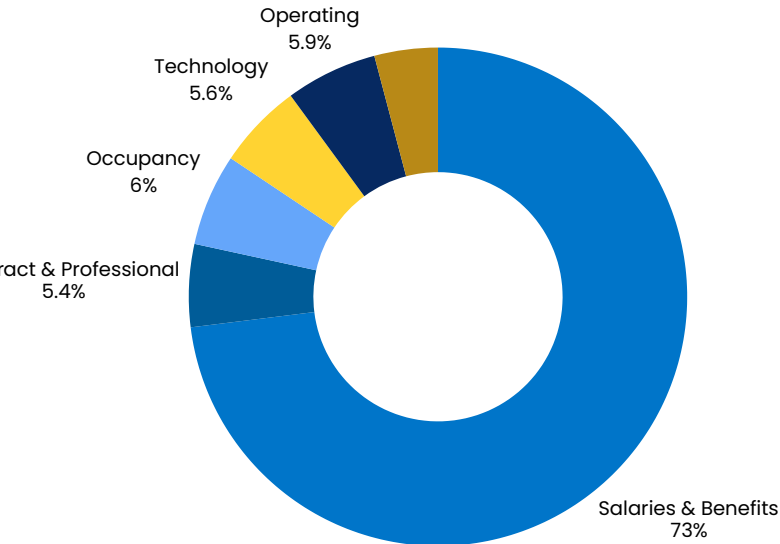
